Results of the Special Congregation Meeting on the Monument Sign

On Sunday July 5th, a congregational meeting was held after worship to discuss and decide on a replacement church sign. Our sign was damaged by an auto accident back in early March, and after several months of conversations and bids from two sign companies, we met to decide which option we would choose.

After much discussion, the congregation voted to replace the sign with a new sign with an LED message board. This upgrade will cost \$32,632 plus the cost of permits from the city. We have \$11,751 from the insurance settlement for the replacement of the old sign, and our Memorial Committee worked diligently to secure an additional \$9,272 from Memorial funds to be used for this project.

That leaves \$11,609 that we must come up with to complete this project. The congregation at Sunday's meeting felt confident the congregation would be willing to make donations to help cover this balance. We need your help to make this project a reality. We are asking for donations to help cover the remaining balance. These donations would be in addition to or above tithes and regular offerings for this special project.

We need to collect these donations or commitments to donate by August 1st to complete this project successfully. If the money cannot be raised through donations, it will have to come from our Church Savings. House and Grounds mentioned several other projects in need of attention, so getting donations for the sign helps us to accomplish these other projects as well.


