### CHURCH BUILDING STATUS

*The church building will remain closed through at least June 7, 2020. Continue to look for emails, videos, and other communication as we strive to remain connected to one another during this time.*



Today (May 6th) marks eight weeks since we have had to close the building due to the

Covid-19 Pandemic. It has been a worrisome, anxious period, and we are still dealing with issues everyday: from food shortages at grocery stores, to closed businesses, to lack of physical connection with family and friends. But we make it through each day as the church, with God's peace, God's hope, and God's grace in abundance. As states and municipalities begin lessening shut-downs and restrictions, we, your leadership for Merriam Christian Church, have begun conversations on what re-opening the church might look like. With a population that falls heavily into high-risk categories for catching and struggling with this disease, our first priority is to be as cautious and safe as possible. We will take each step purposefully and carefully, and adjust as needed based on evolving circumstances. **Your safety, and the safety of**

**all who would come to this building for worship, for meeting, or for help, is paramount during this time.**

With that, based on our conversations, the earliest date we will consider gathering for worship would be June 7, 2020. Over this next month we will begin making preparations for what will need to be done for that date to become a reality, while also continuing to monitor this ongoing, developing situation and make adjustments as necessary.

Please know, if we are able to begin gathering for worship on that date, or when we are finally able to gather, worship is going to look and feel very different than just a couple short months ago. In order to do our best to protect all who might come, we will need to implement many changes and we will need your help to make this possible. As we get closer to an actual re-launch date, we will communicate all of the needs and changes in place. But here is a beginning list of things we will need to adjust:

- *First and foremost: Anyone that is a high risk category, especially if they have other health concerns that increase their odds of catching and struggling with this disease, should stay at home. If anyone has a fever,*

isn't feeling well, has a cough, or any other possible indications of infection, they should stay home and seek medical care.

- When we are in the building, **we will require everyone to wear a mask.** We will have some available, but if you have one please bring it.



- **We will provide vinyl gloves** for anyone who wants them.

- ANY **space used will need to be cleaned/disinfected after use.** So the sanctuary, bathrooms, hallways, stairs, will all have to be wiped down with disinfectant. We will need volunteers to help with this.

- **We will need to maintain a physical distance of six feet at all times.** No handshakes, hugging, or touching outside of your family unit. Children will need to stay with their parents for the duration of worship.



- **We will not offer nursery services at first.** Children's Worship and Wonder lessons will be brought into worship, so everyone can hear the lesson and children can stay with their parents.

- **We will have someone running the elevator, and one person may use it at a time.**

- **We will have one worship service at 10AM initially.** For at least June, we will ask other groups (Sunday school, DWM, Our Gang) to not meet. There will be no fellowship hour at first. We will assess the situation and adjust as we can going forward.

- **Pews will be marked with tape where people may sit,** to maintain at least six feet of separation. Ushers will help with entrance and exit so physical distancing can be maintained then as well.

- **There will be no passing of items during worship.** There will be a basket on the communion table for you to drop your offering/tithe into. We will ask you to bring your own communion (bread/juice, crackers/soda, donut/coffee, etc). During communion we will ask everyone to observe with what they have brought, or to simply take a few moments of prayerful reflection.



- **All Bibles, hymnals, and other items will be removed** from pews so that we do not have to wipe them down after each gathering.

- This is the really tough one – **there will be no singing initially.** Scientists have

discovered this virus spreads quickly when people sing, as we project water vapor into the air that travels farther than six feet. Our denomination, as well as state recommendations suggest singing be avoided initially.

- **We will continue to record and post worship on youtube and facebook, so if you do not feel safe attending, you can still participate in worship. We are exploring ways to stream the service live as well.**



That is what we have so far, but I am sure there will be other items added and adjusted throughout this month. It is quite a list. I know this seems very harsh and restrictive. At first it will need to be to keep everyone as safe as possible. As we move through this moment together, we will assess and evaluate where we can adjust restrictions or possibly lessen them. But this will be a slow, cautious process.

Please know this: even with these drastic changes and adjustments, even with this slow cautious approach, we are still Church. Even without singing, and passing the plate. Even without hugs and handshakes. Even without things being how they used to be (or always were). We Are Still Church. This moment will not break us. This moment will not defeat us. Because We Are Still Church. **It is God's grace and love that connects us. It is God's peace and hope that binds us. It is God's salvation and righteousness that makes us church. We Are Still Church, and we have a mission and a ministry. This pandemic cannot change that.**

Yes, things will be different for a while. Yes, somethings may never go back to what they were, Yes, we will come through this affected and changed. **But we will come through this together, as the Body of Christ, as Church.**

Two things I would ask of you now. **First, be in prayer daily**, for this church and all churches, for our leadership and for me as your pastor, for our country and our leaders, and for all who will most directly be imbued with this virus. We need your prayers. This church needs your prayers. Our country needs your prayers. I need your prayers. **Second, we want to hear your thoughts** on what I have presented here. How do you feel about June 7th as a possible date to gather again? If we do open that day, would you feel safe coming to worship? We will ask the shepherds to contact everyone and get your feedback on these ideas. Please share your feelings and thoughts with them so we can hear from all of you, the congregation of Merriam Christian Church.

**God bless you all. I love and miss each of you. Stay safe.**





# *Your options of how you may give your tithes and offerings during the “Stay-at-Home” Order.*

Merriam Christian Church now provides a number of ways to give.

**Write a check.** Since we are not able to place CHECKS in the offering plate during worship at this time you can still mail it the church or DROP-BY the church and place it in the mail box.

Have funds **automatically withdrawn** from your bank check or savings account or one-time special donations can be made. Go to: <http://www.easytithe.com/merriamcc> to set up your account. Or go to the church website and click on the new giving buttons: With the “auto giving” option you will be able to designate the amount and the timing of your giving – a specific date each month, weekly, bi-weekly, monthly, twice a month, quarterly and annually. You can also designate a credit or debit card versus a checking or savings account.



## **Text giving: 913-444-6397 through your smart phones**

Merriam Christian Church’s (SMS) Text Giving Account has been set up. Our account Number is: 913-444-6397. Members of the congregation or visitors can simply text an amount to that number to get started. The first time you give by this method there is a quick form to fill out on line. Any subsequent giving actions will not require the form to be filled out again.
