Dear Friends,

Luke 14 tells us:
"Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, 'This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.'

As we conduct our Stewardship planning for 2020, we ask each of you, as Disciples of Christ, as members of Merriam Christian Church, as the faithful who gather here in worship, service, and fellowship to estimate. Estimate the cost of your thanksgiving and discipleship. Estimate the gifts you bring before God. Estimate your response to God's grace and love. Just as Jesus told his first disciples to estimate the cost of what they were asking when they sought to be his Disciples, we too must estimate. We estimate what we bring to lay at God's feet. Our finances, our time, our gifts, and our attention are demanded in several places in our lives. To commit some of those here will exact a toll on us. Are we willing to pay it? As we reflect on what God has given us, what is our response? How do I express my gratitude and my thanksgiving? Am I giving God from the first of what I

have, or am I only giving the leftovers, after everything else is taken care of and addressed?

Essentially, we are estimating and evaluating; what do I bring? That is the question we will wrestle with through out September. What do I bring before God when I come here? What time do I bring to spend with God? What gifts do I bring to offer up to God? What financial resources do I bring to further God's kingdom and God's mission in this place? As we work through our stewardship and budget as church, prayerfully consider the question: What do I bring?
