
Worshipping God in Our Work

2023 Chairman Greg Spiegel called the meeting to order. Gratitude to Mike Nichols for all he accomplished as Chairman of MCC Board in 2022.

Devotions: Jeannette-Proverbs 17:17 love at all times. Christ is our BFF.

Minutes of 12/13/22 Board Meeting: Greg asked the board to review the minutes; Motion to accept report by Mike Nichols; seconded by Bruce Roach; board vote, approved.

Current Financial Report: Mike asked the board to review the current financial report; Motion to accept report by Mike Nichols; seconded by Bruce Roach; board vote, approved.

Committee Chair Reports:

Clerk: Betty-There were no changes in December. Total membership is 137.

DWM: Pam-We closed the year out with our annual December luncheon at the Olive Garden on 12/15. Ten ladies were able to participate. As the new year begins, we continue to collect empty prescription bottles taken to Unleashed Animal Shelter for their use. We are also requesting donations of any gently used warm clothing which will be taken to Shawnee Community Services. Our next meeting is 1/19, all women of the church are welcome.

Elders: No report.

H&G: Joel-Campbell Hall damper vent-McCarty was contacted after Bob noticed a problem with damper vent; damper directs heat between the sanctuary and Campbell Hall so it is very important that it works correctly; McCarty installed a new motor and it is working properly. Pastor Robin's office-Walt removed shelving; Dave Ramsey & Bob Pape patched holes in the wall and painted. It looks great! THANK YOU DAVE AND BOB for a great job! Pastor Robin's office door handle & lock-Dave discovered that the entry door from the main office was not working correctly; after he took it apart, cleaned and lubricated, it is working fine now. AED machine-we received notice that child & adult pads had expired; Bob ordered and will install when received. Discussion held that it would be beneficial to have AED machine refresher training. Michelle reported that Robin has a computer and new desk for her office.

Outreach: Pam-We finished our year of service in 2022 as follows: Cooked & packed 150 meals for JoCo Food Ministry on 12/29; Adopted 5 families at MPE for Christmas with \$50 gift card for every child for parents to purchase gifts and \$100 grocery gift card for each family; Packed & delivered 50 Harvesters backsnacks to MPE on weekly basis; 150 delivered over the Christmas break; Weekly deliveries for Meals on Wheels; Continued financial support of World Outreach (includes Disciples Mission Fund, Phillips Theological Seminary, JoCo Food Ministry); and Local Outreach (includes Salvation Army, KC Hospice, Crosslines, City Union Mission, Community & Family Services, Shawnee Community Services, Cancer Action, SafeHome, Sunflower House).

Membership: Jeannette-No game night until March; working on inputting membership surveys into Google contacts; working on new Directory-found software that will allow us to publish electronically and print. A REMINDER TO CONGREGATION to email their pictures or bring to

church so they can be scanned.

Memorial: Emily-A total of \$5,200 has been taken out of the memorial funds to help with cost of sanctuary organ repair; total cost was \$8,187.80. Remainder of cost will come from organ repair fund account set up for donations. Emily Yeh is enjoying having the organ in good working order. An amount of \$11.62 was taken out of special music to make the amount "even" at \$5,200. The only funds now in Memorial are for special music as follows: Ross account \$1,201.79 and Davis account \$160 for a total of \$1,361.79. The following Memorial Accounts were used for the organ repair and now show a zero balance (a page added to the Memorial Books for each account): Ginny Bethel Smrtic, Flo Biehl, Leroy Wisner, Mary Ann Borchardt, Alpha Wickham, Robert (Bob) Owens, Opal Wylie, Joyce Hutchison and Jim Owens. Mike Nichols' name has been added to the Board Chairman plaque in the upstairs hall.

Pastoral Relations: No report. The present Search Committee will become Pastoral Relations Committee effective February when Pastor Robin Colerick-Shinkle joins MCC.

Worship: No report. Pat-suggests bread and challis be carried to the communion table by an Elder.

Media: Bruce_New MCC brochures completed and printed; plans to interview Pastor Robin, along with adding her information to new brochure and website; would like to digitize the MCC historical archive; Facebook will have a poll for new verse on digital outdoor sign; adding children's ministries to Facebook; website facts-886 unique visitors, 1,150 total visits, 209 visits in past 30 days; social media activity has increased 200%, search increased by 9.41%; international views from China, Germany and UK; YouTube views average around 45 views for video.

Personnel: No report **Trustees:** No report.

Old Business:

Jeannette-The committee organizing new pastor installation and 110th anniversary festivities for 2/19 met 1/8 and discussed the following: potluck meal, historical pictures, slideshow in sanctuary, Mayor proclamation, name tags, invitations. Committee will be meeting after worship service each Sunday prior to 2/19.

Greg-Pastor Robin has an installation service she would like to use, she is eager to be involved in the 2/19 service, she will be provided with information.

Greg-Would like to schedule a Board Retreat in January for board, committee chairs and members to have discussion about goals & plans for 2023. Discussion held, Retreat scheduled for 1/21 at 10 am in Campbell Hall.

New Business:

Report that seal on front door needs repair. Joel will ask Jon Beaver to look into it.

Open Forum:

Pat-Concern about MCC bylaws & guidelines; discussion held.

Donna-Suggestion that we have additional "coffee hours" after worship service. Prior to Covid shutdown, it was held every Sunday and people really enjoy the fellowship.

Greg-Scout Sunday is 2/5 and discussion held regarding additionally having Laity Sunday on 2/5. Mike-Civil air patrol group has indicated interest in using space at MCC for meetings.

Mike Nichols closed with prayer.






Boy Scouts Chili Fundraiser

The Boy Scouts will be hosting a chili fundraiser on February 5th at noon.


