## "A Good Name": Daily Devotional

"A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favor is better than silver or gold." (<u>Proverbs</u> 22:1 ESV)

Why do we have names? From Genesis to Revelation, The Holy Bible is full of names for plants, animals, human beings, and everything else! Your moniker sets you apart from others. It helps people identify who you are. This **daily devotional** points to <u>Proverbs 22:1</u> and what it means to have a good name.

How do you get a name?

It was a significant thing to name a child in Bible times. A person was given a name to represent something distinctive or a noticeable physical characteristic, a unique circumstance or hope for the child's future and destiny, as well as a quality the parents hoped the child would exhibit while growing into adult-hood.

Many biblical names demonstrated the parents' commitment to God such as Joshua (Yahweh is salvation) or Samuel (God has heard), and the Supreme Name, Immanuel (God with us).

Good Name vs. Great Riches

In many cultures today, an individual's name often stands for the person. Honor or dishonor is attached to it. People live out their names as self-fulfilling prophecies, making it their lifelong goals to realize what the names mean.

Today's Scripture passage suggests that clues to a person's character are in the meaning of an individual's name. An upstanding name reveals virtuous and upright qualities that are far more valuable than wealth and riches.

What is your name, and what does it mean? How can this daily devotional encourage you to choose an upright reputation over fame or fortune?

Dear Lord, as I discover and reflect on the meaning of my name, help me to put You first, and choose the right character rather than fleeting treasures.

How does the devotional message for today impact your thinking about God's Energy?

Heavenly Father, Thank You that I don't have to depend on my natural strength to get things done. I praise You for imparting Your Spirit's Vitality when needed.
